OUR FOCUS

The Commitments Trust focuses more on the implementation of Inclusive Education concept, and it has promoted with the participation of Parents, Community and Activists at village, the process for the following up of the activity are:

- Motivate and counsel the parents to join their Children with disabilities in schools.
- Promote the Neighborhood centers where children with disabilities can access specialized teaching.
- Develop an easy learning environment, curriculum, and specialized teaching aids, learning devices and we provide them to disabled children.
- Depending upon their disability our team train them in the schools and go for the home visits.
- In the Schools, the children with disabilities will be seated along with the non-disabled children and also our IE Activists will be sat along with the children with disabilities and explain them again to understand. Some of the children with severe disability were joined in the Neighborhood Centers.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- To initiate social mobilization process and facilitate the formation of SHGs/Federations of the Persons with Disabilities.
- To mobilize the SHGs to take up community awareness and initiate community activities for inclusion of persons with disabilities into the mainstream and to set up community resource centers for assessment, treatment, and rehabilitation.
- To provide rehabilitation services for about 12000 persons with disabilities (covering various types of disabilities)
- Provide valued nutrition to the children and malnourished families
- Provide health, nutrition, education and livelihood support the poor and needy
- To initiate Community Based Rehabilitation approaches



BACKGROUND

After the reconstitution of the districts into 31 smaller districts in the state of Telangana, the government also merged disable welfare department into the Women and child welfare department. As part of the new administrative setup, there is no separate department and only one person is made available for disable welfare. This will hamper the focus and not much concentration on the Person with Disabilities [PwDs]. Though it doesn't affect the project, it will be a barrier to access entitlements from the State Government.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

Catholic Health Association of India [CHAI] has been supporting Commitments for thewellbeing of Children with Disabilities in the target villages of Vikarabad and Gadwal districts of Telangana State through CBR approach. The activity was initiated from 1st January 2016 and continuing, Commitments Trust has identified a group of children to provide necessary CBR services including the capacity building of children, parents, communities, and key stakeholders of the communities.

There are **216** CwDs in both the areas of Gattu andDoulthabad.

Special Education Services

Almost 40% of the children in project have intellectual disabilities and all of them were needed special education and physiotherapy services to improve their learning and understanding levels in topics such as ADL skills, colour concept, money concept, clothing, combing, personal hygiene, number concept, gate training, walking and physical health condition.

The team regularly visited the children and counseled them on these skills. Furthermore, they connected the children to health centers and neighborhood centers and trained their parents on how to work and care for their children at home.







Procurement and distribution of medicines for seizures

As part of the planned activities, some of the children with mental disabilities were having seizures and required medicine on a regular basis. Since their parents were not able to afford the cost of medicines every month, we provided the required medicines regularly with the support of NIEPID.

Provide education support to the needy and school going children

We have provided education support to school going children, including ones with disabilities, so that they will be able to continue education and have a proper foundation for their future.

Vegeshna Foundation is one of our partners in this effort. We observed that the children are regularly attending the schools, practicing good hygiene habits such as brushing, bathing and wearing of clean clothes.

Their parents felt happy with the positive change in their children. Many of the parents are illiterate and unable to afford money for the special needs children. Due to that many of the children are not able to continue their higher education like Inter, Degree and higher studies. Based on the need, we provided complete set of books, bags, note books and some other educational related material.

The children could bring out their reallife issues and problems. Through this initiative, we tried to encourage the communities to have Children trained and meaningful debate by using cost effective material and resources. Some of the topics touched were war creates disability, barrier free environment, traffic rules, cleanliness, worship house and temple, pension, plantation, monsoons, prevent accidents, importance of education etc.

Access to Livelihoods for the poor and caregivers of CwDs

Poverty is one of the major challenging issues affecting most of the families. As both the parents go for labor/agriculture work, their disabled child does not get proper attention and care. In such cases, we have started supporting and guiding the selected families in having more manageable livelihoods, such as sheep raring, weaving material, sewing machines, establishing utility and vegetable shops etc, to allow them to care for their child more easily.



ABOUT THE PROJECT

Child line India Foundation (1098) is working for the protection of the rights of the children in **Jogulamba Gadwal District.**

The project is working in **12 Mandals of Gadwal** since January 2019. CHILDLINE works for the protection of rights of all children aged from 0 to 18.

Their special focus is on all children in need of care and protection, especially the more vulnerable sections, that includes:

- 1. Victims of child sexual abuse.
- 2. Street children and youth living alone on the streets.
- 3. Child labourers working in the unorganized and organized sectors.
- 4. Domestic help, especially girl domestics.
- Children affected by physical / sexual / emotional abuse in family, schools or institutions.
- 6. Children who need emotional support and guidance.
- 7. Children of commercial sex workers
- 8. Child victims of the flesh trade
- 9. Victims of child trafficking.
- 10. Children abandoned by parents or guardians.
- 11. Missing hildren.
- 12. Run away children.
- 13. Children who are victims of substance abuse.
- 14. Differently-abled children.
- 15. Children in conflict with the law.
- 16. Children in institutions.
- 17. Mentally challenged children.
- 18. HIV/ AIDS infected children.
- 19. Children affected by conflict and disaster.
- 20. Child political refugees.
- 21. Children whose families are in crisis.







Livelihoods Enhancement and Access to Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) Services for the Children with Disabilities (CwDs) in Hyderabad

BACKGROUND

Poverty, lack of awareness, and early marriages are the major reasons of Disabilities. Because of the disabilities, children are being forsaken, most of the children are becoming orphans or semi-orphans. Children in difficult circumstances face several problems, particularly the girls face different kinds of problems and are not able to come out of these difficult situations. Particularly in the urban areas/slums the girl Children with Disabilities (CwDs) would face various problems and not be able to access food, water, sanitation, and other basic facilities. They are also not able to access the education, health and other facilities at household and society levels. The problems are multifold, and a comprehensive strategy is required to address these kinds of problems. Though there are several efforts made by the Government and other agencies towards addressing the problems, those efforts are not able to get the expected results. The interventions like providing pension and other social security programs are not able to create an enabling environment to improve the 'self-dignity' and are not able to contribute to the overall development process. There are several barriers at household, schools and other institutions levels and need to be addressed in a systematic way. Many times, the challenges faced by these groups are not recognized by the

The urbanization and its pressure on the people living in the urban areas/slums are much more complicated for the lives of these girl CwDs.

Because of the institutional bottlenecks, accessing the educational institutions (schools) and health services were becoming the major challenges for the children with special needs. Hyderabad and Secunderabad cities have a greater number of girls CwDs and they are not able to access any

society and not able to address them.

The project will highlight the issues of the girl CwDs and also how to improve their learning abilities through a focused and intensive approach with community participation.

There are several policy provisions to this social group, particularly Government will provide SADAREM certificates, Pensions, Aids and appliances, scholarships to continue the education, subsidy in travel and transportation, schoolbooks, and uniforms etc. All these facilities are accessible to the selected children and the project team has also facilitated to get the benefits like SADAREM certificates, pensions and aids and appliances.

This project is supporting about 300 Children with Disabilities (CwDs) for their Medical rehabilitation services, livelihood enhancement of their caregivers and for education and to access state entitlements along with sanitation and housing facilities.


